The Stanislaus County Office of Education alternative program is comprised of both court and community school programs. This report will only address the court school portion of the program. The County Office of Education operates the educational program at Stanislaus County West Campus. Students complete grade appropriate, standards-based academic courses and work on basic skills to complete requirements or earn high school credits. There are opportunities to complete GED requirements as well as high school diploma requirements while detained. Students at the West Campus who have been identified as needing special education services are provided supplementary services through credentialed special education teachers and para professional support.

The process follows the "Toolkit" published by our COE to guide committees through the review and recommendation of texts as well as a vote at whole-division staff meetings followed by a recommendation at a board meeting for adoption/approval depending on grade level. All past recommendations have been approved by our SCOE Board.

Chromebooks are ordered initially based on enrollment counts of students and extras are ordered throughout the life of the adoptions due to enrollment surges and/ chromebook loss.

Statewide Assessments

Where the most viable option, LEAs were required to administer the statewide summative assessment in ELA and mathematics. Where a statewide summative assessment was not the most viable option for the LEA (or for one or more grade-level[s] within the LEA) due to the pandemic, LEAs were allowed to report results from a different assessment that met the criteria established by the State Board of Education (SBE) on March 16, 2021. The assessments were required to be:

- Aligned with CA CCSS for ELA and mathematics;
- Available to students in grades 3 through 8, and grade 11; and
- Uniformly administered across a grade, grade span, school, or district to all eligible students.

Options

Note that the CAAs could only be administered in-person following health and safety requirements. If it was not viable for the LEA to administer the CAAs in person with health and safety guidelines in place, the LEA was directed to not administer the tests. There were no other assessment options available for the CAAs. Schools administered the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments for ELA and mathematics, other assessments that meet the SBE criteria, or a combination of both, and they could only choose one of the following:

- Smarter Balanced ELA and mathematics summative assessments;
- Other assessments meeting the SBE criteria; or
- Combination of Smarter Balanced ELA and mathematics summative assessments and other assessments.
